# THE PRODIGAL SON

The Gospel parable today reflects upon some of the harsh realities of family life: about breakups and reconciliation, about love that has limits and love that has none. Many people, parents especially, can identify with the role of the Father in this parable who bravely holds-on to the ideal of unconditional love, even in the most difficult of circumstances. If we take a look at the young man who asks for his inheritance in advance we watch him sink deeper into darkness and bring shame upon his family. And yet, despite his greed and waywardness the father waits patiently, never giving-up hope that his Son would one day return home. And upon his return we see mercy taking

over; mercy and love symbolized in the robe, the ring and the sandals. Against all the odds, he is welcomed as a son, not as a servant. The father doesn't even say once that he forgives. He loves totally and that includes forgiveness. As in this case, it is mercy that is shown to heal and repair our wounds; and if that is true among ourselves and within our families, how much more it is between ourselves and God.

The parable of the Prodigal Son contains a call for us to practice mercy. Our human condition means we tend to do wrong, to reject others, to become greedy, to be proud, and to fall short of our own high standards. We need an outpouring of mercy in our own lives and in the Church at this very moment. The Gospel today encourages us to love as we have been loved, with an outpouring of mercy. And even when we struggle to do this – like the older son – we know we are still loved. This is the meaning of unconditional love.

#### Calling Times / Office Hours


